1. IDENTIFICATION OF THE JOB AND TASKS

A manual tool used in masonry work, especially for applying, carrying, or projecting mortar or plaster onto wall and ceiling surfaces during coating and finishing tasks.

2. RISK ASSESSMENT

2.1. Identification of risks

- Accidental spills of contents causing slippery surfaces.
- Muscle pain or injuries from strained postures during repetitive use.
- Blows from the trowel falling from a height.
- Minor cuts on hands from worn metal edges.
- Handle or container breakage during use.

2.2 Risk Assessment

2.3. Preventive Measures for Identified Risks

- Do not fill the trowel beyond its maximum capacity.
- Use protective gloves to improve grip and prevent cuts.
- Check that the handle is securely attached before each use.
- Adopt ergonomic postures and take frequent breaks.
- Avoid leaving the trowel in walkways or on scaffolds unsecured.

2.4. Corrective Measures in Case of Accident

- Muscle injuries: Apply cold or heat, rest, and consult a doctor if pain persists.
- Cuts: Wash, disinfect, and cover the wound with a sterile dressing.
- Falls due to spills: Clean immediately and check the contents or handling method.

2.5. Evaluation of the Effectiveness of the Measures

Periodically check the condition of the tool and reinforce good practices in its use and maintenance through ongoing training.

3. INSTRUCTIONS FOR USE

3.1. Aspects to Consider When Preparing for Use

- Ensure that the trowel is clean and free of visible damage.
- Check that the trowel is securely held during use.
- Prepare the work area with good lighting and a stable surface.

3.2. Aspects to Consider During Use

- Load an appropriate amount of mortar or plaster.
- Transport and apply the contents with controlled movements.
- Do not use the tool to strike surfaces or as a container for incompatible materials.

3.3. Warnings

- Do not load the trowel with more than you can safely carry by hand.
- Do not use if it has cracks or damage.
- Do not leave in elevated areas without securing it.
- Do not use as a step, support, or container for corrosive liquids.
- Do not allow use by minors or untrained persons without supervision.
- Use only under adequate lighting conditions.
- Do not use if experiencing fatigue, under the influence of alcohol, or after taking medication or substances incompatible with the task.



4. MAINTENANCE AND STORAGE

4.1. Cleaning

Wash with water after each use and dry. Remove all residues before they harden.

4.2. Inspection

Check the handle, edges, and bottom of the container. Replace if any damage, deformation, or cracks are detected.

4.3. Storage

Store in a dry place, avoiding excessive weight on the tool.

4.4. Recycling and Environment

Dispose of at a designated collection point according to current regulations when the product reaches the end of its service life.
